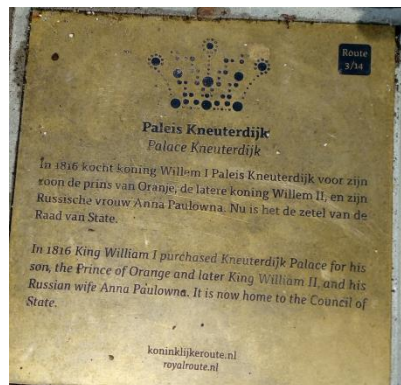
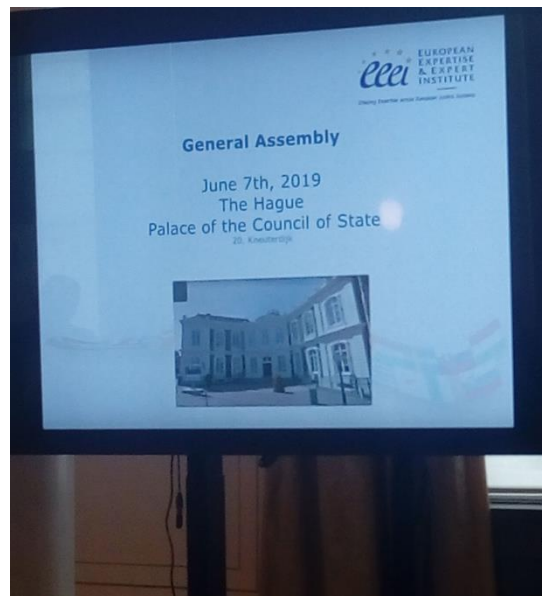


European Judicial Expert Forum

On 7 June 2019 in The Hague, the city of peace and justice, the annual General Assembly of the European de l'Expertise et de l'Expert Institute (EEEI) was held in the Netherlands, the forum being held at the State Council, old Dutch institution. The President of the High Administrative Court - part of the State Council - Mr. Bart Jan van Ettehoven was very excited to invite us to the beautiful and old building of the Council. He has a special appreciation for the judicial expertise, is author of some articles in this field and is a renowned lawyer for high-quality professional experts.



The program provided a very interesting discussion platform based on several topics related to the two pillars of expertise: excellence in giving the courts clear, concise and impartial opinions, and the work of the judicial expert.

The EEEI was created in 2006 from the need to evaluate the changing economic and social environments, the need to achieve a global vision in the field of justice. The European Institute of Expertise wishes to respond to these major challenges, to stimulate scientific research at a time when the rules for the management of a process are drawn up at European level for later application in the national legislation of each Member State. This structure includes institutions, personalities, honorary members, active members, legal entities and individuals from European Union member states - who through their professional activity carry out such activities, which proved the elaboration of projects, publications and activities in the field legal, economic, technical, forensic expertise, and which are continually involved in the promotion and implementation of the objectives and the mission of the EEEI.

The European Institute of Expertise provides a forum for researchers and practitioners who are interested in modernizing legal and judicial systems. According to their position, the experts have to give their competence as true "knowledge holders" in their specialty, respecting the legal contexts in which they are called.

Association within the Institute of magistrates, academics, lawyers and experts of any specialization contributes to attracting public attention and increasing its efficiency.

The European dimension of the Institute falls naturally in the contemporary context and is a fundamental basis for a comparative reflection on the judicial and historical experiences of all EU countries.

From Romania, the members of the legal entity: Transilvania University - Braşov, the Supreme Court of Justice, Braşov Court of Appeals, as well as individuals who have been accepted through the professional activity and the recognition of this European forum: technical expert Judicial Prof. Grănescu Ana Maria - PhD supervisor at OVIDIUS University Constanta - President of the International College of Continuing Professional Training of Experts and Specialists of SC International Expert Management, as well as lecturer dr. Mihaela Agheniței from Dunărea de Jos Galați University - associate researcher at the Institute of Legal Research Andrei Rădulescu from the Romanian Academy.

During the General Assembly of the EEEI held on June 7, 2019, new members, natural persons from the European Union countries, including Judicial expert Dr Barbu AM Daniela, were validated.

At the same time, the General Assembly of the EEEI decided that as an expert in legal sciences, lecturer dr. Mihaela Agheniței of the University of Dunărea de Jos Galati - member of EEEI to be co-opted as a member of the Executive Committee, decisional forum of this European structure. Such actions took place in previous years, the last two being: on 18 May 2017, the EEEI organized the annual Assembly in London at Hamilton House on 1 June 2018 in Barcelona at Colegio de la Abogacia de Barcelona (ICAB) .

Together with the two co-chairmen, Beatrice Deshayes (lawyer) and Etienne Claes (expert), the EEEI Executive Committee initiates and implements European Commission projects to streamline justice and harmonize the EU's own legislation with European legislation and principles.

At all these meetings a special emphasis was placed on the case law of the European Court of Human Rights for defining procedural fundamental rights, which is increasingly necessary because collective risks (public health, industrial safety, terrorism) have reached cross-border dimensions.

In this regard, EEEI shall offer all interested parties:

- a procedure for the harmonization of judicial expertise in Europe;
- periodic reports on its activity,
- an interdisciplinary discussion and research forum on various aspects of expertise;
- a European data bank on expertise.
- a pole of excellence for a comparative reflection on the training of experts.

A very important aspect of the EEEI's activity was the European Commission for Efficient Justice (CEPEJ), held in Strasbourg on 3-4 December 2018, where the principles of ethics for the use of artificial intelligence in the Judiciary System and its procedure were adopted, emphasis on the 5 principles of ethics in the use of artificial intelligence in the judiciary and procedures.
